COMMUNITY SCHOOLS

We are pleased to present you with the Annual Education Report (AER), which provides key information on the 2021-22 educational progress for the W-A-Y Niles. The AER addresses the complex reporting information required by federal and state laws. The school's report contains information about student assessment, accountability, and teacher quality. For the 2021-22 school year, schools were identified based on previous years' performance using definitions and labels as required in the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). A Targeted Support and Improvement (TSI) school is one that had at least one underperforming student subgroup in 2021-22. An Additional Targeted Support (ATS) school is one that had a student subgroup performing at the same level as the lowest 5% of all schools in the state in 2021-22. A Comprehensive Support and Improvement (CSI) school is one whose performance was in the lowest 5% of all schools in the state or had a graduation rate at or below 67% in 2021-22. Some schools are not identified with any of these labels. In these cases, no label is given.

Our school was identified as a Comprehensive Support and Improvement School.

The W-A-Y Niles Program is designed to help every student with their own unique interests, skills, and ways of learning. The program provides a personalized learning experience for students who struggle with traditional high school. Students in the W-A-Y Program become researchers and develop customized standards-based learning plans with a Mentor around topics that truly appeal to them. Highly-qualified W-A-Y teachers assess and align all projects according to state content standards, ensuring that each student completes the programs with a high school diploma.
